
FOLLOWING RULES

Knowing what is and isn't allowed is reassuring for a 2- to 5-year-old. Your role is to set the rules.

Each rule must be...

Clear

"You can play outside once you've put your blocks away." "If you throw your toy, you won't be allowed to play with it."



Coherent

"I want us to do something that doesn't involve screens. After your show, we'll go play outside, and I'll leave my cellphone in the house."



Concrete

"We sit down when we eat." "Turn the pages of the book slowly."

Consistent

"As always, we look both ways before crossing the street."

Logical

"You drew on the wall, so you're responsible for cleaning it up."

Keeping your home safe and secure helps reduce the number of rules you need to set.

Store cleaning products, medications, cat litter, and other small objects out of your child's reach; cover electrical outlets and install a barrier for the stairs. Your child will be free to have fun without always hearing "No!"
